






FIGURE 11: CONSIDERING FREEDOM OF OPPOSITION PARTIES TO CRITICISE THE GOVERNMENT TO BE OF HIGH IMPORTANCE,





Figure 5.2. The public and private sphere in eight countries





- Shora <u>regulace lobbistů</u> (uznaná živnost, rejstříky/EU, revolving doors, cooling-off periods, výkazy výdajů, sankce, př. USA, Kanada)
- Shora <u>regulace příjemců</u> lobbingu, vysokých úředníků, politiků (rev. doors, střet zájmů, majetková přiznání, otevřené diáře, sankce)







